
#### **2023 ROTARY SENIOR ART COMPETITION**

## **Principal's Report**

Firstly, I would like to thank our entire school community for a wonderful Term 3 at Richmond High School. In Week 6 I celebrated 12 months in the relieving Principal role. On reflection I have thoroughly enjoyed the role of Principal, in particular the positive support and encouragement I have received from staff, students, parents and the wider community in a time of rapid change, especially across our school environment.

Over the last 12 months we have together created several new learning spaces, a cola, a shaded area in the Year 7 quad is in the planning, new murals have been put up on walls across the school grounds, new pathways and grassed areas have been created, new outdoor furniture has been purchased and lots of painting has taken place. Richmond High has also seen some

#### **Stranger Danger Reminder for all families**

**Speak to Trusted Adults**: teach your children to confide in trusted adults, such as parents, teachers, or school staff, if they feel uncomfortable concerned about anything. We are here to support them.

Please talk to your child about the topic of sextortion. Recently we had Rachel from STYMIE talk to all of our young people about not trusting people online. 
# RED NOSE DAY




#### **Year 10 Macbeth Drama Workshop**
