



Richmond High School BYOD Specifications

Bring your own devices for use as educational tools at Richmond High School will need to meet some basic requirements.

Hardware

Device and size	Laptop with a minimum 11 inch / 28 cm, Suggested maximum 14 inch / 36 cm screen.
Input method	A physical keyboard. A separate mouse may be of some assistance on smaller devices.
USB ports	Sufficient ports to enable saving to a USB stick or adding external devices like a mouse etc.
Network Connectivity	Device ideally supports 5Ghz 802.11n or 802.11ac . This may labelled in several ways, "Dual Band", "802.11abgn", "802.11ac" are examples. If unsure please contact the School prior to purchase
Battery life	Should be sufficient for a full 6 period day.
Additional suggestions	Maximum weight 2Kg Minimum 8Gb RAM Carry case Loss and breakage insurance Backup method (USB memory stick etc.)

The Wireless specification is no longer critical as the school has enabled both 2.4 and 5 Ghz technology, so 95% of devices should connect without issues.
